Rotary Awareness Month

Fellow Rotarians,

January is *Rotary Awareness* month and as I start to think of that term, Rotary Awareness, my mind becomes swamped with thoughts of ways to make people aware of Rotary. One of my classmates, D5890 (Houston area) DG Ed Charlesworth, raises awareness with his car wrapped in Rotary messages (see photo). We can rent billboards, place labels in donated books or on goods that we sell for fundraisers, or place signs on, or in front of, Rotary club projects. We can put a decal on our car. We can simply wear our Rotary lapel pin ... every day ... and be prepared to give a short, concise, answer when we are asked, "What's Rotary?"

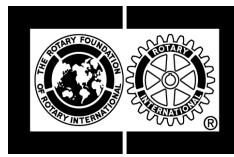
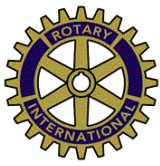

Rotary Dental Project Honored

The Rotary Dental Project, a Burnet County cooperative effort, has been honored as Project of the Year by the Texas Rural Health Association. The Rotary Dental Suites is the result of a project undertaken by the Highland Lakes Health Partnership, which is a cooperative effort of healthcare providers in the Hill Country.

The HLHP partnered with Rotary Clubs in Marble Falls and Burnet, the First Baptist Church of Marble Falls and the Business Center of Marble Falls to build a clinic at the church and provide dental care with the help of more than 200 dentists, hygienists, dental assistants, office staff and other interested individual and volunteers. The Rotary Dental Suites opened in January and, as of Nov. 15, the clinic had seen 485 patients utilizing 264 volunteers to do 553 extractions, 187 fillings and 162 cleanings.

Rotary Dental Suites was born out of a project undertaken by the HLHP five years ago in cooperation with the Texas Dental Association. During that project, in Burnet, more than 1,000 patients were treated in three days with the help of hundreds of volunteers. The project clearly pointed to the need for a dental clinic to supply dental care to individuals who cannot afford to use private providers and led to the creation of the Rotary Dental Project.

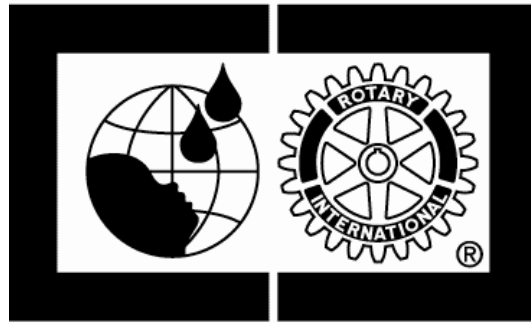
The Highland Lakes Health Partnership is made up of doctors, dentists, social workers, chiropractors, hospitals, government employees and others interested in better healthcare in the Hill Country. The HLHP volunteers meet monthly and often start a project at a roundtable discussion, then develop it to completion. Currently there are four roundtables: eldercare, which has led to sponsorship of a yearly Eldercare Fair; children's health, which has led to a yearly Children's Health Fair; suicide prevention, which includes a hotline and new healthy living endeavor.

The Rotary Dental Suites project is the second HLHP project to win the Texas Rural Health Association Project of the Year Award.

Afghanistan first in world to use new vaccine against polio

Critical step as global eradication effort faces entrenched challenges

15 December, Kabul – A new vaccine against polio will be used for the first time today in polio immunization campaigns in Afghanistan. The bivalent oral polio vaccine (bOPV), recommended by the Advisory Committee on Poliomyelitis Eradication, the global technical advisory body of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative as a critical tool to eradicate polio, can provide the optimal concurrent protection needed by young children against both surviving serotypes (types 1 and 3) of the paralyzing virus. This will vastly simplify the logistics of vaccination in the conflict-affected parts of this country. This sub-national immunization campaign, from 15-17 December, will deliver bOPV to 2.8 million children under five in the Southern, South-Eastern and Eastern Regions of Afghanistan.

Of the three wild polioviruses (known as types 1, 2 and 3), type 2 has not been seen anywhere in the world since 1999. This achievement led to the development of monovalent vaccines, which provide protection against a single type with greater efficacy than the traditional trivalent vaccine. To determine whether a bivalent vaccine could effectively protect children living in areas where both types circulate, a clinical field trial completed in June 2009 compared bOPV with the existing vaccines. For both types 1 and 3 polio, bOPV was found to be at least 30% more effective than the trivalent vaccine and almost as good as the monovalent vaccines, yet in a package that could deliver both at once.
